Particularly popular with American charterers Loon regularly usually welcomes high-profile guests to explore the Bahamas and Caribbean. This year the 55m Newcastle 5500 series will be chartering Europe from May until October. Although much of the summer season is already booked, Loon has just released dates for the Monaco Grand Prix, Cannes Film Festival, and two other weeks mid-season.

### FAQ With the Captain of M/Y LOON, Paul Clarke:

#### 1. What cryptocurrencies does M/Y Loon accept?

We currently accept bitcoin and are open to other cryptocurrencies such as ETH, BCH, DOGE, XRP, etc. However, we would have to review each individual coin offered to make a decision on its value.

### 2. Many still deem Cryptocurrency as being "Volatile", how will you go about managing this?

We don't see any major drawbacks. It's really just a way to increase our exposure to more clients. As well as, to make it easy for Crypto Whales to charter M/Y Loon without having to

sell their Crypto into currency to pay for the charter.

## 3. Will the whole management of the yacht now be dealt with through cryptocurrency, Ie crew salaries etc?

We will continue to operate the yacht in the usual way, with the additional factor of adding crypto as an additional currency for charter bookings.

### 4. Who decides to accept crypto? The yacht owner, or the management company?

The decision was made by our owner. Inclusivity is really important to all of us and accepting crypto is another way to expand on this.

With the official @motoryachtloon Instagram account holding more followers than any other Superyacht globally, and Loon crowned the most Instagrammed superyacht to date, the social media platform is the best place to keep up-to-date with everything Loon including the itineraries planned for this summer, charter availability, and insight into all the luxurious amenities onboard.
