

M/Y A2 Successfully Relaunched Into The Wet Basin At Pendennis Shipyard

The world recognised shipyard reported on their socials earlier this week that Pendennis successfully relaunched M/Y A2 back into their wet basin.



The 42.35m vessel was originally known as 'Masquerade of Sole', but was renamed M/Y A2 after arriving at Pendennis in 2011 and being rebuilt in 2012. All three decks of the

Superyacht were extended to 47m, along with a full-paint job that left the yacht looking modern. In regards to the interior, during the installation, the Pendennis team worked closely with the interior build experts, Peter Marino Architect (Remodel) to help exceed the owners' expectations.

Upon completion of the rebuild, Captain A2 of M/Y A2 praised Pendennises services, saying:



Two People Rescued From Yacht Amid Blackpool Storm

The RNLI have rescued two people after a yacht became trapped in treacherous conditions off the coast of Blackpool.

The 33ft yacht got into trouble at 11:34 am last Friday (October 29), which led to a rescue effort by Lytham St Annes Lifeboat Station. The station's All-weather Lifeboat, commanded by Coxswain Andrew McHaffie, was deployed to the incident.

The lifeboat arrived just in time, with the RNLI stating that even minutes of delay would have meant a "slim chance of survival" for those involved.

Mr Mchaffie said he knew the team needed to work quickly to save those on board the yacht, as it was rapidly approaching surf on the shore.

Through Mr McHaffie's expert navigation, the boat was able to get close enough for fellow crew member Andy Hall to board the yacht. He was then able to connect the two vessels with a towline. The yacht was then towed to the marina at the Wyre Estuary in a rescue that took five hours.

One of the people aboard the yacht sustained minor injuries, however, the pair were otherwise unscathed.

Do the locals know how to look after Superyachts?

What about BREXIT?

Funnily enough Brexit has had a hugely positive effect on the Superyacht industry when it comes to visiting yachts. Now the **UK is no longer part of Europe** there are lots of potential benefits for Superyachts.

Refit for example: Yachts leaving refit in Northern Europe have traditionally made a trip north to Norway in order to clear out of Europe before re-entering. This can now be done in the UK as yachts head south rather than make an unnecessary trip north. They can also buy fuel much cheaper, stock up on provisions and tie in a guest trip in London at the same time.

This is a huge benefit and potentially massive cost saving for many Superyachts. It's also one more reason for Superyachts to add the UK to their summer itineraries. And, you are unlikely to be anchored within sight of another Superyacht. Just like the good old days!
